



We reached there at 10:15 am and started off by visiting the sisters who run the place. They were happy to make a difference in the quality of these children's lives. Then we proceeded to visit the children and were happy to see almost thirty children with smiling faces who were reasonably well dressed. We got to introduce ourselves and they too were quite comfortable with us. We spent a few minutes with them until the "onasadya" that was arranged for them arrived.

We could not get the chance to serve them the food or feed them since their clothes had to be changed and some of them could not eat solid food. We dined along with the sisters, who insisted we have the sadhya along with them although we were interested to serve the food to them and have our share later. The sadhya was a feast to all the senses and the payasam was delicious along with the added happiness we got from spending time with those loving sisters. After we had finished eating our sadhya, we could not wait to be with those happy faces again. We rushed to meet the children who had just finished their food. Many of the children appeared to have multiple physical and mental disabilities. There were separate dormitories for boys and girls and we visited both of them and made sure we mingled with every one of them. We asked about the sadhya and they replied happily that they loved it. Some of them were soon in a sleepy mood and most of them had already dozed off.

Before leaving, we made sure we got a picture with the sister and the little one, Pradeep, who did nothing but laugh and smile loudly at anyone who passed by, which made all of us laugh and cry at the same time. We left by 2pm with so many things to share.

THAIVERU

The NSS unit of SCMS SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY (SSET), Karukutty in association with the forest department of Athirapally gave a helping hand to the hillock behind the cattle breeding farm, Thumburmuzhi, which had about 14 debris flows in the past two years during the devastating flood happened in Kerala. In the first phase of the project "Thaiveru", more than 50 bamboo saplings were planted at Konnakuzhy in Pariyaram grama panchayat near Athirapally on September 15, Sunday. The inauguration of the project was done by Mr. N Satheeshan (Forester,SFO) by planting bamboo sapling. Addressing of the gathering was done by Mr. N Satheeshan and Mr. Rakesh A(SSET programme officer) by explaining the positive effects of bamboo plants on controlling landslides. The project was volunteered by about 35 NSS volunteers of SSET and the residents of Konnakuzhy who dug the pits and planted bamboo saplings under the supervision and advice of officers of the forest department. The programme officer Rakesh A expressed an opinion of expanding this project to other NSS units of colleges in the state, thereby lending a hand to protect the mother earth.
