



<u>STEM CELL DONATION AWARENESS SESSION AT SCMS SCHOOL OF ARCHITECTURE(SSA)</u>

TKMS BMST Foundation India, a non-profit organization dedicated to the fight against blood cancer and blood disorders conducted a day long blood stem cell donor registration drive at The SCMS School of Engineering and Technology and the SCMSSchool of Architecture on 15th October 2022.

A team of 4 professionals took the awareness session for about 100 students, parents, teachers and non-teaching staff as 2 sessions; one forenoon and the other afternoon. After an hour of informative session, real life stories of a few people who survived the blood stem cell transplant and their potential donors who took the strenuous journey were shown. Later the students were demonstrated on how to register themselves as potential stem cell donors by giving their cheek swab samples.

Every 5 minutes someone in India receives the shattering news that they have been diagnosed disorders like Thalassemia or Aplastic Anemia. A stem cell transplant from an HLA-matched donor is often the only chance at survival for these patients. The Awareness campaign aimed at signing students as potential blood stem cell donors and registering themselves to help save a life.

Students have come to the realization that becoming a donor is a serious commitment and though it is difficult to predict the outcome for someone who receives the donation, the possibility that the donation can help save a life is over whelming.





On February 28, 2023, the SCMS Institute for Road Safety and Transportation (SiRST) organized a road safety awareness session for autorickshaw and bus drivers in Palissery.  transportation.




