UN Road Safety Week



As part of the observance of UN Road Safety Week 2026, a road safety awareness

session was conducted at EXL Transport, SmartCity Kochi, on May 9, 2026. The session was led by Dilipkumar K. G., Deputy Director of SiRST.

The programme It highlighted the objectives of UN Road Safety Week and emphasized the crucial role of education and awareness in reducing road traffic accidents and creating safer roads for all.

A total of 74 employees and drivers participated in the session.

Road Audits



A road safety audit was conducted by SiRST at Mamala Junction and Port Trust Junction on May 15, 2026 with the objective of

identifying road safety issues and recommending corrective measures to reduce accident risks and improve traffic management. The audit was led by Adarsakumar G Nair, Director SiRST, and Dilipkumar K G along with Remya Y K and Dr. Gulsavin Guruprasad. The team carried out a detailed inspection of the junctions focusing on traffic flow, road geometry, pedestrian safety, visibility issues, signage, road markings, and potential accident-prone areas. The audit also evaluated the effectiveness of existing traffic control measures and infrastructure facilities. Based on the observations, suitable recommendations were proposed to enhance road safety, ensure smoother traffic movement, and improve overall commuter safety at both junctions.

Corrective Training Programmes



As part of efforts to enhance road safety and rehabilitate accident offenders, the SCMS Institute for Road Safety and Transportation (SiRST), in collaboration with IDTR Kerala, conducted two corrective training programmes for drivers from April 20–24, 2026, and May 4–8, 2026, at SCMS School of Engineering and Technology, Angamaly. The five-day programmes witnessed the participation of 23 individuals in the first batch and 22 in the second. The sessions were led by a team of internal and external resource persons and focused on key aspects of road safety, accident prevention, and responsible driving practices. Participants benefited from interactive sessions, workshops, and practical demonstrations designed to strengthen their understanding of safe driving behaviour and traffic regulations.

As part of its road safety awareness and knowledge-sharing initiatives, SiRST conducted an online expert talk on the topic “Behavioral Factors of Driving” on April 29, 2026, through Google Meet. The session was led by Adarsakumar G. Nair, Director of SiRST.

The talk explored the various behavioural factors that influence driving practices, including road-user attitudes, decision-making processes, risk perception, and their overall impact on road safety.

The programme provided participants with valuable insights into safe driving practices and the importance of responsible conduct on the road.

Organised as part of the JCI Cochin Lead Connect Conclave, the webinar was attended by 23 participants.

Know Your Vehicle Programmes



SiRST conducted two “Know Your Vehicle” road safety awareness programmes during the period, aimed at enhancing public understanding of vehicle safety, road discipline, and responsible road use.

The first programme, titled “Know Your Vehicle and Road,” was held on April 22, 2026, at the KMRL Operation Control Centre

for 30 women employees. The session was led by Adarsakumar G. Nair, Director, SiRST, along with Deepak Xavier and Nikhil Asok N., Assistant Professors at SiRST.

The programme focused on creating awareness about vehicle systems, safe driving practices, road conditions, and responsible road-user behaviour. The resource persons provided practical insights into vehicle maintenance, driving safety, road awareness, and the importance of understanding vehicle-road interaction in accident prevention. The session was highly interactive and helped participants strengthen their knowledge of vehicle operation and road safety.

A second “Know Your Vehicle” programme was organised by the Niravu Welfare Fund in association with SiRST at Idanila, Angamaly, on May 3, 2026. The programme aimed to improve public awareness of vehicle safety, road discipline, defensive driving, and emergency response measures. Sessions covered vehicle safety inspections, vehicle maintenance, tyre and suspension checks, cockpit drills, defensive driving techniques, and road safety awareness. Participants also received practical training in first aid, trauma care, CPR, choking management, wound and burn care, and the management of snake and insect bites.

The programme was inaugurated by Mujeeb T. A. in the presence of Kishore Kumar T. N. and Francis Panikkar. Around 60 participants attended the event.

The training sessions were led by Nikhil Asok N., Rakesh A., and Deepak Xavier from SiRST.
